Job Training Attestation

During the Incentive Claim Stage, Solar Contractor and their job trainee(s) shall: (1) review the San Diego Solar Equity Program (SDSEP) job training requirement information in the SDSEP Program Handbook (Section 3.3.4 – Additional Incentives – Job Training) and (2) complete and sign this Job Training Attestation. All documents should be submitted to the SDSEP Program Administrator (PA) via the application Box folder.

Workforce Partnership Requirements and Basic Agreement

In order to earn the additional job training incentive (up to \$1,000) on an SDSEP project, the Solar Contractor agrees to hire a job trainee for a minimum number of 40 hours of paid job training.

The trainee(s) may participate in the SDSEP project in a direct or support role, performing photovoltaic (PV) installation and/or project design/project engineering work. The work of the trainee(s) may be performed on or off the project site. Eligible training hours do not need to be solely spent on the specific program project and can be across the Solar Contractor's other non-SDSEP projects. Hours can be allocated across the Solar Contractor's other non-SDSEP projects; however, training hours cannot be counted against multiple incentive programs or SDSEP applications.

The Solar Contractor's insurance, specifically worker's compensation, must cover the job trainee(s), and the Solar Contractor agrees to pay the trainee(s) prevailing wages as defined by California Department of Industrial Relations (DIR).

Eligible Trainees and Job Training Programs

An eligible (qualified) job trainee is an individual who is either:

- a. A temporary employee currently enrolled in an eligible job training program; or
- b. A permanent employee who graduated from an eligible job training program within 12 months of the installation project.

Eligible job training programs include those offered by a California Community College or other PV-training programs offered to the public by local government workforce development programs, community non-profits, private enterprises, or the electrical workers union, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 569, with 40 or more hours of instructional and/or hands-on PV installation and design training.
